Information on the above referenced Burglary of a Residence was distributed previously via Nixle (the Police Department’s new information distribution system). For those of you not yet subscribed to the Nixle service, I will repeat the information regarding the burglary here.

On Wednesday, May 18, 2011, Spring Valley Village Police responded to a report of a burglary of a residence in the 1400 block of Cedarbrook Drive. Upon investigation, police believe sometime during the nighttime hours, a suspect or suspects entered the attached garage through a back door without

forcing entry, then entered the residence from the garage through an unlocked door and stole the victim's purse and an Ipad computer.

While canvassing the neighborhood for clues, police learned that a neighbor had seen a suspicious vehicle Tuesday night at approximately 10:30 PM parked on the street nearby but did not report this suspicious activity to police at that time. The vehicle is believed to be a silver or tan Toyota Corolla.

Regarding the above listed Burglary of a Motor Vehicle cases, the majority of those were reported to have occurred in non-residential areas of the city. However, one of the other motor vehicle burglaries did occur in the driveway of a residence in the 8700 block of Cavell Lane. On May 14, 2011, at approximately 2:30 AM, one of your nightshift officers was patrolling the area when he observed a suspicious vehicle parked on Cavell Lane. He then noticed the interior light was on inside another vehicle parked in a residential driveway. Upon checking this second vehicle, the officer found a male suspect inside the vehicle in the process of burglarizing it. The suspect, a 21-year-old who lives in the Denver Harbor area of east Houston, was arrested and charged with Burglary of a Motor Vehicle.
